This year's meeting is being held on Aug. 14, at Grand Traverse Resort in Acme, in conjunction with the 2023 Michigan Family Medicine Conference & Expo (Aug. 12-15). There is no cost to attend the Annual Meeting, where members receive a complimentary lunch.

Resolutions are due by June 21 to be considered at the Annual Meeting.
